
Book Fair and Book Week Dress Up Day

If you have, or know of, any children who may be attending MPS next year in Kindergarten, please contact our school office. We are currently preparing Kindergarten information.



Camp Australia News

Camp Australia have removed their "Flexible Booking Options" (Gold, Silver, and Blue account structure) ("FBO") and returned to a simple, single 'Recurring booking' option at Minchinbury Public School OSHC. This began on Monday, 12th October 2020.

The decision to remove FBO is driven by Camp Australia's commitment to be customer led.

Earlier this year, Camp Australia undertook research to hear directly from parents regarding Camp Australia's booking options. In these sessions, they heard overwhelming feedback that FBO were confusing and too complex and if they returned to their previous simplified booking options, it would create a more parent friendly booking experience.

This research informed the design of their new Parent Portal set to launch in December for all families. This new Parent Portal will significantly improve the way parents can make and manage their bookings with Camp Australia through an industry-leading app for their phone! Not only that, but the app will become the way they can look at who is working in the service, their billing, and a gallery of what is happening in the program for their children.

The removal of FBO was important for a successful Parent Portal design to give families what they want. FBO was designed to give parents more options and to make life easier; it didn't achieve this end.

With the return to a more simplified booking structure, there is no impact for most families as the new recurring booking option is equivalent to our current Silver account applying to 60% of our families.

As we want to ensure a smooth transition for parents at Minchinbury Public School, we will grandfather the current fee arrangements for our Blue and Gold account holders to the end of Term 4 for any existing bookings and new bookings that were made before Monday, 12th October 2020. This was communicated to parents on Thursday, 24th September 2020.

Intention to apply for Year 7 placement in a selective high school in 2022

Dear Parent/Carer

Selective high schools cater for academically gifted students with high potential who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic standard. Selective high schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, and by using specialised teaching methods.

Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 11 March 2021.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2022, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

Detailed instructions on how to apply online will be available in late September 2020 at https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7.

The application website opens at that link on 13 October 2020 and closes on 16 November 2020. You must apply before the closing date.

There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Team for assistance after 13 October 2020.

You must submit only ONE application for each student.

The tear-off slip below is not an application and the school cannot apply on your behalf.

How To Install Skoolbag On Your Smartphone

For iPhone and iPad users:

- 1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
- 2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
- 3. You will see your school appear, click "Get" then "install".
- 4. The app is FREE to download.
- 5. When installed click "Open"
- 6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

- 1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
- Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
- 3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
- 4. Click the "Install" button.
- Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
- 6. Click "Open" when installed.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

Please Note: Some brands of Android phones need the setting in "Notification Manager" changed to "Allow" instead of "Notify" in order for the push notifications to work. The phone must also be running at least version 4 system software to run the app.

For Windows 81 Phone and Windows 81 or 10 device users:

1. Go to the Windows Store on your 81 Windows Phone or Windows 81/10 Device

- 2. Search for "Skoolbag" in the keyword app search
- 3. Install the Skoolbag app
- 4. Find your school either by using the keyword search or location service.
- 5. Click the "Pin" icon to pin the school tile to your Windows Phone home screen.
- 6. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup"
- 7. Toggle the Push Categories that are applicable to you by tapping the on/off switch.
