Principal's COVID-19 Message

These times continue to be some of the most challenging times that we may see in education. As a school, we love having the parents/carers at events and sharing in our learning experiences. Unfortunately, this just cannot happen at this time.

I have included a number of notes that have been sent home to the community via hard copy, Skoolbag and on our website. Please take the time to read them again. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact our school office on 9832 1488.

I do need to draw your attention to one very specific piece of information that has been communicated to all families. If your child has displayed any signs, even very mild, that are considered to be COVID-19 symptoms, they must not be at school. The Department of Education requires that all students returning to school after displaying symptoms, returns to school with a negative COVID-19 test.

 Where a parent/carer is unwilling to allow their child to undertake a COVID-19 test or provide the school with a negative COVID-19 test result, the student is to be excluded from school for a 10 day period. Additionally, the student must be symptom free for at least three days before returning to school.

I am going to thank you in advance for being as understanding as possible if we need to contact you about your child being unwell.

I would also like to express my true gratitude and admiration for our office staff who have communicated with our families as respectfully as possible.

















In Term 3, we have been learning about informative texts. We have learnt about a range of different farm animals including pigs, cows, sheep and horses.













In maths, we have been learning about halves. We got to make fairy bread. It was so much fun!






KF friends were given certificates for their excellent bookwork. We can see why Miss Dimond felt that they worked so well.

Students who are unwell and/or displays signs of being unwell

Dear families,

Let me begin by saying how much we appreciate having you as our community. In incredibly difficult times, it is so much easier to work together when we are all trying to move in the same direction.

There has been updated advice received by our school from the NSW Department of Education about how we work with families when their child appears to be unwell whilst at school.

The following information is taken directly from advice written by the NSW Department of Education:

- During the COVID-19 pandemic, anyone with symptoms of COVID-19 (fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, loss of taste, and loss of smell), even mild symptoms, should not be at school.
- Schools should encourage staff and parents to arrange for the person who is unwell to be tested so
 they can return to school as soon as possible once their symptoms have resolved to minimise the
 absence from school. For people who are unwell with respiratory symptoms, a negative COVID-19
 test result must be received and sighted by the school.
- Staff and students should only return to school when they have received a negative COVID-19 test
 result and their symptoms have resolved. Confirmation of the negative COVID-19 test result must
 be received and sighted by the school. Negative test results are communicated by NSW Health
 through SMS notifications.
- Where a parent/carer is unwilling to allow their child to undertake a COVID-19 test or provide the school with a negative COVID-19 test result, the student is to be excluded from school for a 10 day period. Additionally, the student must be symptom free for at least three days before returning to school.
- COVID-19 testing for students with complex health or disability may be challenging. In these
 situations, schools are to ask the parent/carer to have their child assessed by their medical
 practitioner. Where a medical practitioner determines that a COVID-19 test is not required, a
 medical certificate must be provided to the school to confirm that the student does not have
 symptoms that warrant a COVID-19 test. The certificate must also indicate that the student is able
 to return to the school environment.

At Minchinbury Public School we are a motivated and respectful community of learners.

I apologise for the size and boldness of the last point. The reason for this is that we need to clarify for everybody that this is a requirement of the NSW Department of Education. We need to follow these directions to keep our community as safe as possible.

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CHANGES TO AFTERNOON PICK UP ARRANGEMENTS

Dear parents/caregivers,

In order to maximise student learning time and to ensure the safety of all members of our community, we are making some changes to our afternoon pick up arrangements.

As of next Monday, 17 August, all K-2 students and their siblings will be dismissed from the school gates at 2.50pm.

- **2.50pm: Kindergarten students and their siblings will be dismissed from the** back gate on Barossa Drive as their parent/carer arrives to collect them. Please follow the signs along the path and maintain physical distancing.
- 2.50pm: Stage 1 students (Year 1 & 2) and their siblings will be dismissed from the front gates on McFarlane Drive as their parent/carer arrives to collect them. Year 1 students will continue to be dismissed from the top gate. Year 2 students will continue to be dismissed from the bottom gate. Please maintain physical distancing while waiting for your child/ren.
- 3.00pm: Remaining Year 3-6 students will be dismissed from classrooms to leave the school via the front gates. Any students who attend Out Of School Hours Care will be picked up by OOSHC employees. K-2 students who have not been picked up by 3.10pm will be sent to the teacher on bus duty at the front of the school. Parents/carers will need to pick those students up from the bus duty teacher.

How To Install Skoolbag On Your Smartphone

For iPhone and iPad users:

- 1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
- 2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
- 3. You will see your school appear, click "Get" then "install".
- 4. The app is FREE to download.
- When installed click "Open"
- 6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.





For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

- 1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
- 2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
- 3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
- 4. Click the "Install" button.
- 5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
- Click "Open" when installed.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

Please Note: Some brands of Android phones need the setting in "Notification Manager" changed to "Allow" instead of "Notify" in order for the push notifications to work. The phone must also be running at least version 4 system software to run the app.



For Windows 81 Phone and Windows 81 or 10 device users:

- 1. Go to the Windows Store on your 81 Windows Phone or Windows 81/10 Device
- 2. Search for "Skoolbag" in the keyword app search
- 3. Install the Skoolbag app
- 4. Find your school either by using the keyword search or location service.
- 5. Click the "Pin" icon to pin the school tile to your Windows Phone home screen.
- 6. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup"
- Toggle the Push Categories that are applicable to you by tapping the on/off switch.
