### Early Stage 1, Term 1 Overview

Welcome to what will be an exciting first year of big school! We have a motivated team of

teachers eager to start the learning journey with our Kindergarten students - Mrs Williams KW, Mrs Fisher KF, Mrs Popple KS, Mrs Vyse (Mon-Tues) and Mrs Bell (Wed-Fri) KB. Supporting our students with their learning are some experienced teachers including: Mrs Booth (library/music) and Mrs Vasek (LaST). Our Early Stage 1 Assistant Principal is Mrs Williams.

### Key Learning Area Overview

Below is a brief overview of the content that will be studied in each KLA in Term 1:

### English

This term, the concept explored will be, tuning in to language. Students will develop their listening skills so that they can tune in to sounds. Students will focus on phonological awareness skills, which is the different ways that language can be broken down into smaller parts such as word awareness, syllables, rhyming and onset and rime. Students will be exposed to nursery rhymes and quality picture books.



To support the explicit teaching of reading and writing in the early years, modelled reading, handwriting, speaking and listening lessons are embedded in daily literacy sessions.



### Mathematics

This term, we will begin the number strand, focusing on whole numbers and addition. Students will be learning to become familiar with numbers 0-20 and number combinations to 10.

In Term 1, we will also cover patterns and algebra, time, 2D space, position and data.



### Geography

Students will explore people and places, with particular focus put on their school days. They will develop an understanding of what makes a place special and how this may differ for different people.



#### Science

This term, students will be exploring the *Physical World*. Students will observe the physical characteristics of objects and how they move. This unit of study allows students to investigate push and pull forces.

#### **Creative Arts**

There are many opportunities for our learners to participate in the creative arts in their classroom. In visual arts, students will make



pictures and other artworks.

#### Music

Students will have music lessons with Mrs Booth. They will be learning about the concepts of pitch, duration and tone. Students will be involved in learning experiences that will allow them to sing, play, move and organise sounds.

### PD/H/PE

Students will participate in a weekly dance program. Our weekly dance program encourages students to control their body movements, follow directions and have fun.

To ensure that our students have a positive start to the year, teachers are explicitly teaching Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) lessons to their students, focusing on targeted rules and expectations that encourage them to be respectful, safe learners. Students will also participate in lessons on how their bodies grow and change. They will develop their interpersonal skills and learn to identify and describe different emotional responses for a range of situations.

#### Seesaw

Seesaw is a free application used at Minchinbury Public School. Seesaw is a digital platform that allows teachers to communicate with families and keep them in the loop on the learning that their child is doing at school.

## Stage 2 Term Overview Term 1 2021

### English

Students will recognise how authors connect with readers and use various language devices. They will look at how authors create characters to drive plots and to represent themes. Students will make connections between themselves and elements of texts. They will use the writing process of planning, writing, reviewing and editing to write quality, Stage-appropriate narratives. They will focus on including action, tension, dialogue and exciting endings in their narratives.

#### Spelling

Students using a range of strategies, including knowledge of letter–sound correspondences and common letter patterns, to spell familiar and some unfamiliar words

### Handwriting

Students are learning to compose texts using clearly formed joined letters of consistent size slope.

### **Reading**

During guided, modelled and independent reading sessions, students are learning to draw on an increasing range of skills and strategies to fluently read, view and comprehend a range of texts.

### **Mathematics**

Classes will be taught Number (Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication, Division, Fractions and Decimals and Patterns and Algebra) according to students needs through short, sharp and focused daily activities and monitoring student's progress. Other Strands that will be taught this term are: 2D Space, 3D Space, Length, Area and Time.

### Homework

Homework will be handed out from Week 3 of this term. Students will get homework on a Monday and it is to be returned in on the Friday.

### Creative Arts

Visual Arts Students will participate in lessons that relate to our History unit. They will make artworks that represent a variety of subject matter.

Music- Lessons will continue with Mrs Anderson.

### **History**

This term we will be beginning our unit on **First Contacts.** 

Students will describe and explain effects of British colonisation in Australia. They will describe people, events and actions related to world exploration and its effects. Students will identify the original inhabitants of Australia and investigate their traditional way of life. Students will discuss the significance of world trade routes and identify reasons for the voyage of the First Fleet.

### **Science**

Students will begin our unit on **'Physical World.** They will focus on light, heat and electrical energy and how contact forces affect the behaviour of objects. Students will develop their understanding of energy as a resource that can be generated and transferred. They will observe how energy and forces are used in the manufacture of products and in systems.

### **Physical Education**

Students will learn a Skills Based Program this term. The skills in focus will be; basketball and Cross Country. They will play and practice modified activities. **Personal Development & Health** 

Students will participate in lessons relating to <u>PBL</u> and <u>Anti-Bullying</u> this term.



### Stage 3, Term 1 Overview

I am so excited to see our Year 5 and 6 students return in 2021. We have a motivated team of

teachers leading our Stage 3 team this year – Mrs Kristy Troy (Assistant Principal), Mrs Stephanie Emmanouilidis 5/6E, Mrs Siff Mohammed 5/6M, Mr Robert Pasfield 5/6P, Miss Vanessa Plumb 5/6V & Ms Caitllyn Wignell 5/6W. Supporting our students with their learning are some experienced teachers including: Mrs Elliott (teacher librarian); Mrs West (RFF) & Mrs Anderson (music).

### **Getting Involved**

There are many opportunities for Stage 3 students to be involved in a range of extra curricula activities that foster their talents including: band; dance groups; drumming; choir; PSSA sporting teams; creative arts camps; public speaking competitions; debating and reading club.

### Key Learning Area Overview

Below is an overview of the content that will be studied in each KLA in Term 1:

### English

The unit of study this term is *Reflecting and Adapting.* 


Students will determine themes that are commonly found in literary texts and discuss why some texts have lasting value. They will look at how authors transform and adapt texts to suit different contexts, audiences, purposes, times, places, perspectives and cultures.

Modelled, guided and independent reading, writing, spelling, grammar and punctuation, speaking and listening lessons are embedded in daily literacy sessions.



#### Mathematics

Students will be taught Number (addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, fractions and decimals and patterns and algebra). Other



strands that will be taught this term are: angles, two dimensional space, three dimensional space, position, length, data and chance.

Problem solving across the strands will be a key focus for all Stage 3 students throughout the year.

### History

The unit of study for the first semester in Stage 3 is *Australia as a Nation*. This unit allows students to develop their historical inquiry skills by investigating how and why Australia became a nation, who the people were who came to Australia, how Australian society changed throughout the twentieth century and the contributions of significant individuals and groups made to the development of Australian society.

#### Science and Technology

The focus unit for this semester is *Physical World.* Students will explore and describe some contact or non-contact forces. Through the process of inquiry, they will investigate how they can make a force stronger or weaker. They will explore the effects of changing the strength of a single contact or non-contact force.

### PD/H/PE

In Personal Development and Health, students will focus on *Relationships*. They will explore how empathy, inclusion and respect have an impact on themselves and others and how their uniqueness changes over time. Physical Education lessons and school sport remain an integral part of our weekly physical education program. This term, students will be taught explicit skills needed for playing netball along with being given practice for Cross Country. PSSA trials for cricket, league tag and newcombe ball will take place early in the term.



#### **Creative and Practical Arts**

There are many opportunities for our learners to participate in the creative arts in their classroom and across the school. Mrs Anderson



delivers a comprehensive music program during the Stage 3 teachers' RFF time. Mrs West delivers a quality visual arts program where students will create,

appreciate and view a range of artworks related to the History unit, Australia as a Nation, and Science unit, Physical World.

#### Homework

Weekly homework tasks in Stage 3 are only set for students whose families have requested they complete homework. The homework may be modified by the classroom teacher to suit the learning needs of individual students. If you have any questions or concerns about your child's homework please see the class teacher.



All classes will publish some of their work on the app, Seesaw. Parents are encouraged to download the app so that you can be a part of your child's learning journey.

#### **Stage 3 Events**

Stage 3 students will have the opportunity to attend the Stage 3 Sport and Recreation Camp at Point Wolstoncroft. The Camp will take place in Week 6 of term 3. More information to come during the term. This year, Year 6 students will be involved in a number of fundraising activities to help pay for the Year 6 Farewell. More information to come closer to the events.

#### Year 6 Shirts

All Year 6 students will receive their Year 6 shirts in Week 3. Year 6 students wear their Year 6 shirts to school every day except for Fridays (sport days).

## **Collection of students in the afternoons**

Please do not collect students in the afternoon if you have not spoken to the parent/carer of the child. Even if you are a relative or close family friend, do not ask a child to go home with you without first talking to the parent/carer.

We have had some stressful situations in which a parent/carer comes to collect a child in the afternoon and a relative has already collected the child in the afternoon without informing the parent/carer.

## **Timing of messages to students**

Please contact the office before 3pm if you need to communicate a message to your child.

Office staff members will not walk to the shops to deliver messages to your child when you have called the school after 3pm.
